In the 1880 Census, Eliza F. Murphy (33, born about 1847 in Kentucky), a white married female, was living in District 5, Casey, Kentucky, with her husband, **Sylvester Murphy** (37), sons Thomas F. Murphy (6) and Joel H. Murphy (4), and her mother-in-law, Francis "Fannie" Spragens Murphy (70). Sylvester was a son of Ralph Elkins Murphy and Francis "Fannie" Spragens Murphy.

Edgar Murphy (4), must have been a child of Joel H. (25; 21 when conceived). He would not likely have been a child of Roscoe (16; 12 when conceived) due to his age.
